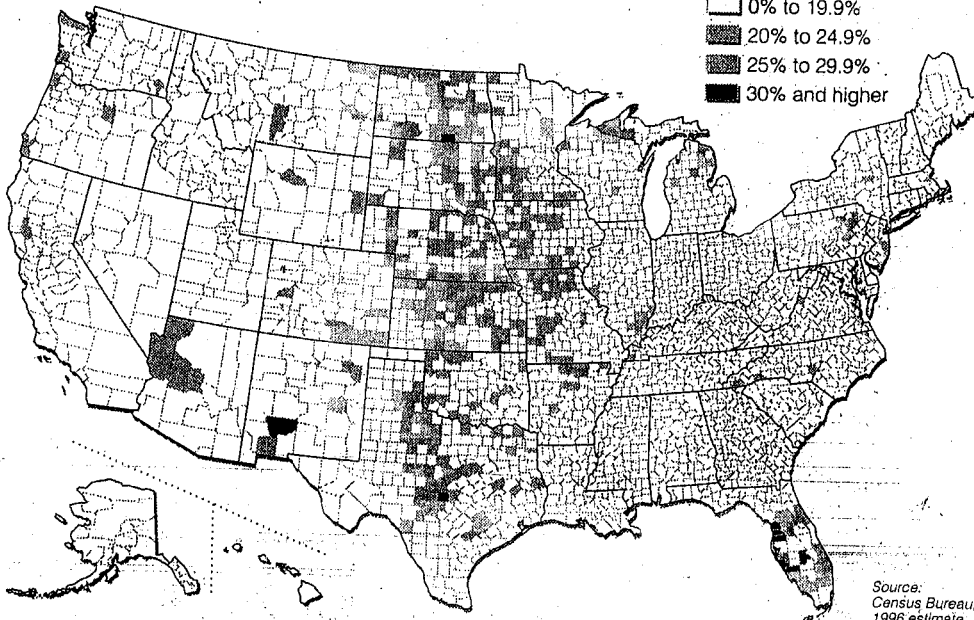
## Staying Put on the Plains

While Sun Belt states like Arizona and Florida have large proportions of old people, much of the Midwest has high percentages of elderly as well, as young people move away from rural areas. In many counties, elderly now make up one-fifth to one-quarter of the population.

- 0% to 19.9%
- 20% to 24.9%
- 25% to 29.9%
- 30% and higher

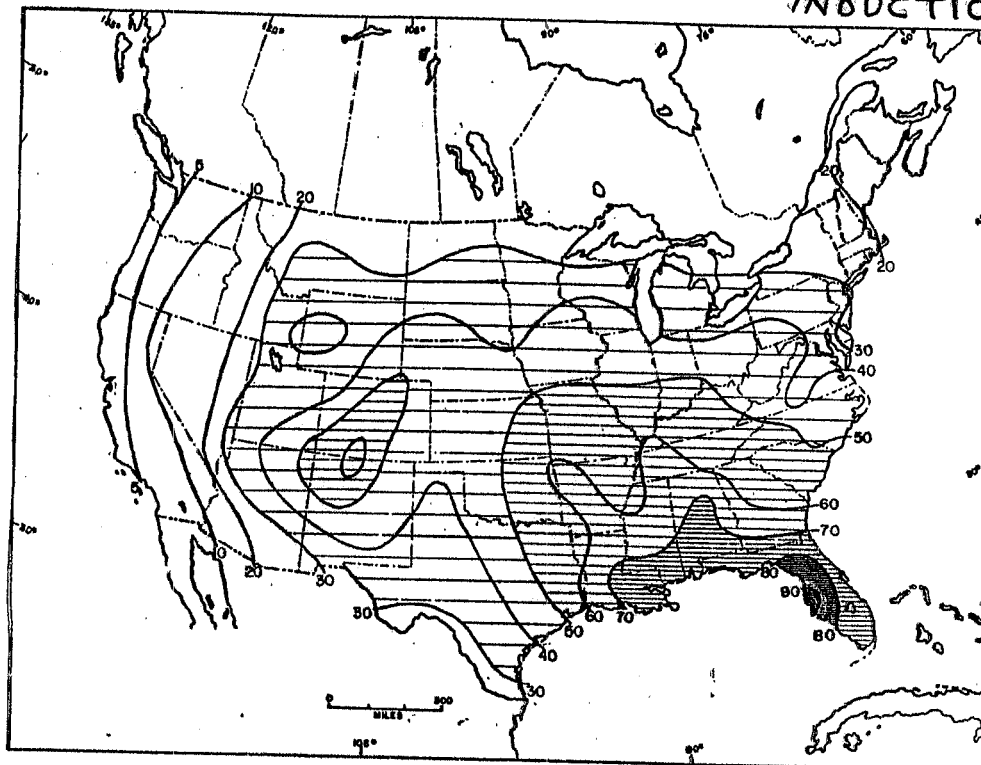


FIGURE 5.3. Number of days per year with one or more thunderstorms in the vicinity.

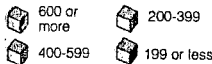

## Raising Money In Manhattan NYT 8/29/04

When it comes to raising money for presidential campaigns, the Upper East Side is the place to be. Its 10021 ZIP code was the top ZIP code in the nation for the contributions to the presidential campaigns and national party committees, with more than \$5 million in donations to both sides from Jan. 1, 2003, through June 30, 2004.

The blocks that gave more to Mr. Bush and the Republican Party tended to be concentrated east of Fifth Avenue, while Mr. Kerry and the Democrats raised more money in much of the remainder of Manhattan, especially on the Upper West Side.

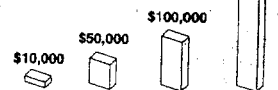
