This exam will focus on the material covered during the first third of the term by syllabus topics:

Topic I - Introduction - What is Geography

Topic II - Geographers' Tools

You are responsible for the information contained in class lectures, textbook and atlas reading assignments and the extra credit sheets. For Chapter 13 in the 10th edition read p. 467 and pp. 470-72 (for the 9th edition read p. 490 and pp. 492-94) and skim the pages between the "The Structure of This Chapter" and the "Summary" at the end of the chapter. Follow the outline for Part I of the course that is attached to the syllabus for the major topics and readings we have covered.

There will be multiple choice and true/false short answer questions, some of which will be aimed at a map and/or a diagram, and one essay question.

Be familiar with general concepts and definitions. Remember, there is a *glossary* of terms at the back of the textbook.

Know the **map location** of the place names for **Europe and Africa** on the <u>Place Name List</u> (see next page) **and** the location of the **countries listed below.** This will in the form of a matching question.

For the essay: You will be given a choice of topics to write on. You will choose one. The choices will relate to basic concepts in geography and methods of study, and to the use of geographic techniques.

On whichever topic you select, you will have to write at least a full-page, grammatically correct essay in which you address and explain all parts of the question. Lists and outlines will receive no more than half credit (maximum of 5 points) and then, only if they are complete.

Neatness counts. Write the essay in pen, not pencil. If I cannot read your writing, points will be deducted.
