GEOG 101 Section 02 is asynchronous. There are no formal class meeting times. You may proceed at your pace with my guidance and reminders to move forward. Lectures and other course material may be viewed at any time after posting and required assignments submitted for grading at any time prior to a due date.

Review the syllabus carefully. Be aware of the requirements and calendar.

Assignments and exams, which are based on lecture material and the themed segments of the course, will have due dates with time deadlines to keep you moving forward at a steady pace. A lateness penalty will be applied.

At the end of each of the three segments of the course, there will be a timed-exam that focuses on the material covered in just that segment. You will have a 4-day window to take the exam, but only one try per exam and once you start the exam you must complete it. Questions and answers are scrambled every time the exam is opened by a student. Everyone sees the same material, but in a different order.

<u>Check your Hunter email on a regular basis</u>. Throughout the semester I will email the class reminders of due dates, textbook readings and supplemental information, including any extra credit options.

Be sure to use your "myHunter" account when contacting me and always include your full name and class in the header. Office hours via Zoom may be arranged by appointment.
