**INTRODUCTION:** There are 62 counties in NYS ranging from the urban counties of NYC to the agricultural counties of western NYS to the wilderness counties of the North Country. **Each student will "adopt" three randomly assigned counties.** These counties come from different areas of NYS. You will use them throughout the semester as the basis for regional topical comparisons. **PURPOSE:** This exercise will acquaint you with your assigned counties and help you start building a regional comparison.

# **ASSIGNMENT:** This exercise has TWO PARTS.

## PART I.

Using the *Moon Handbook*, the *I LOVE NEW YORK* website (<a href="www.iloveny.com">www.iloveny.com</a>), the EPODUNK reference page (<a href="http://www.epodunk.com/counties/ny\_county.html">http://www.epodunk.com/counties/ny\_county.html</a>) and the county web sites by way of <a href="http://www.nysgis.state.ny.us/">http://www.nysgis.state.ny.us/</a> create a comparative geography of your three counties that includes all of the following. **Do this is chart format.** 

- **1. Location** of each county (a) within NYS (site and situation), (b) in relation to New York City and (c) in relation to each other.
- **2.** A general description of each county's **physical characteristics** in terms of (a) area, (b) generalized landforms and (c) climate.
- **3.** A general description of each county's **population** (head count and concentration). Be sure to use **2010 census** data not 2000 census data even though some sites have yet to update their information.
- **4.** A statement of each county's general **economic situation** as portrayed by its web site or *Moon Handbook* entry. What are the **main activities** that employ people?
- **5.** At least one **pertinent fact** (current or historical) **or trivia** that caught your interest. Does the county have a claim to fame? (Also see <a href="http://www.iloveny.com/About-The-State/Trivia-And-Facts.aspx">http://www.iloveny.com/About-The-State/Trivia-And-Facts.aspx</a>).

### PART II.

Go to the **Geography of NYS Course Page** via the Dept. of Geography's home page. From the **HANDOUTS** section, print a NYS map with county names. (There is a small practice map on page 2 of this exercise.) Then go to the NYS home page at <a href="www.state.ny.us">www.state.ny.us</a>. Click on **COUNTIES** next to the "*I Love NY*" logo (<a href="http://www.nysegov.com/map-NY.cfm">http://www.nysegov.com/map-NY.cfm</a>). Locate your three assigned counties. (You can start by playing the "Guess the County" interactive game at the top right corner.)

# Annotate the outline map as follows. Remember to attach it to Part I.

- 1. Outline and label your three counties in black.
- **2.** Locate, mark with a **DOT** and label the <u>county seat</u> (governmental center) of each of your counties. See <a href="http://countymapsofnewyork.com/index.html">http://countymapsofnewyork.com/index.html</a>.
- 3. Mark the location of the <u>City of Albany</u> (the state capital) with a **DOT** and label it.
- **4.** Locate <u>New York City</u> (your home base) on the main map (not the inset map) and yellow-highlight the five boroughs.

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
